


Urban river survey development workshop

An Urban River Survey (URS) development workshop was held in 2012 aimed. This aimed to identify how to enhance this scientific assessment method and suite of tools that supports the work of river managers in urban environments.

Attendees included representatives from wildlife and river trusts, local authorities, the Environment Agency, universities and the private sector. A report précises discussions on topics including the Water Framework Directive, River Restoration and Ecosystem Services.

My interest in fluvial restoration brought me into the RRC in February 2012 as an Erasmus placement scholar. During my placement I was involved in a number of activities associated with research projects on river restoration science. Following my MSc graduation in Environmental Sciences in July 2012, I worked for the Cranfield Water Science Institute to assist with a scoping project that investigated the ecological status of the Upper Lea river corridor in order to develop a river restoration plan. In October 2012 I joined the RRC as Information Assistant to help

develop the NRRI resource, and the RESTORE River Wiki. After work I change my wellies for a pair of tap dancing shoes. In the future I plan to undertake a PhD in freshwater and river ecosystem ecology. I am keen to improve knowledge on how interactions between ecological processes and varying hydrologic and geomorphic processes in rivers affects river ecosystem integrity and function.
